

CO₂ OFFSETTING

Offsetting contributes to **neutralizing the impact of our emissions** on the planet. Air France's ambition is thus to complete all the actions aimed at reducing emissions by supporting projects that restore natural environments, capture or avoid the production of CO₂.

To obtain this balance, our company financially supports projects such as **reforestation, actions to protect forests and the development of renewable energies** while guaranteeing a positive impact on local populations.

Reducing and offsetting our CO₂ emissions

For many years, Air France has been committed to reducing its environmental footprint and offers its customers a responsible travel experience, through concrete actions – modernizing its fleet, promoting eco-piloting, reducing the weight of on-board equipment on its aircraft, recycling waste, eliminating single-use plastic, and more.

For the emissions that cannot be reduced, Air France contributes to carbon-neutral flights at different levels – regulatory, proactive and voluntary.

REGULATORY OFFSETTING

Air France contributes to offsetting its CO₂ emissions through European and international emissions trading schemes, implemented industry-wide.

EU-ETS, emissions trading scheme – since 2012, Air France has been subject to the application of the European greenhouse gas emissions trading scheme (EU-ETS) within the scope of intra-European flights.

CORSIA, a global carbon offsetting scheme – as from 2021, for international flights, airlines have agreed to maintain their CO₂ emissions at 2020 levels, via a global carbon offsetting scheme (CORSIA).

PROACTIVE OFFSETTING

As of 1st January, 2020, Air France will proactively offset **100% of CO₂ emissions on all its domestic flights***.

Concretely, this represents on average **over 450 flights** per day and **over 57,000 customers** concerned.

This offsetting will take the form of a participation, via our partner EcoAct, in **projects certified at the highest international standards** to support reforestation, forest protection programmes or biodiversity and renewable energy actions. Business or leisure travellers, companies or employees of the Air France group will be able to travel throughout France* in a **carbon-neutral way**.

Air France will be one of the first airlines to offset the emissions generated by its domestic flights.

VOLUNTARY OFFSETTING

In addition to regulatory offsetting schemes and carbon-neutral domestic flights, **Corporate Customers** can opt for voluntary compensation of all their flights. The emissions generated on all their business trips are calculated annually and offset by financing major certified reforestation projects.

Among Air France's Corporate Customers, Ubisoft, one of the video game industry leaders, signed in 2019 a contract guaranteeing carbon-neutral business trips for all its employees.

For Joaïkim Tuil, Communication Director for France at Ubisoft, " Our environmental footprint is of major concern to us, and is an almost natural concern for a technological company. We have a workforce of 3,500 staff in France, whose average age is 32. How can we not pose questions about our future? "



Air France has chosen to work with EcoAct to offset the emissions of its domestic flights and voluntary offsetting schemes of its Corporate Customers.


A pioneer in carbon offsetting in France, and an active project developer, EcoAct is notably a founding partner of the Gold Standard for the Global Goals, one of the main project certification standards contributing to carbon-neutral flights.

EcoAct has thus developed or co-developed over 70 carbon-offsetting projects worldwide, in countries including Brazil, Ecuador, India, Kenya, Thailand and currently France.

Air France's carbon offsetting partner analyzes each project in line with 7 risk categories – political, legal, social, environmental, industrial and reputational. The economic, social and environmental co-benefits of the projects are taken into account in accordance with their contribution to the Sustainable Development Goals.

Air France and EcoAct together define a portfolio of projects for which carbon capture is controlled in the field by recognized organizations.
